WHY IS THIS SO IMPORTANT?

An estimated 480 000 learners who enrolled for Grade 10 in 2013 did not make it to matric in 2015 – **a dropout rate of more than 41%** (Equal Education).

Many suffer due to a lack of learning resources and poor teacher support with the biggest load being carried by learners in rural areas. Without a fair chance to learn and to prove themselves these learners are ill equipped for exams or for further careers.
